

ATAR TRIO LAUNCHES MOUNT NEBO

On March 10 the Atar Trio, featuring pianist Ofer Shelley, violinist Tanya Beltser and cellist Adiel Shmit (who will perform in the current series instead of the trio's member Marina Kats), will launch Mount Nebo, its Israeli-American series of concerts. The concert will be followed by concerts in Virginia, New York and Indiana, and then back home in Israel at the Felicia Blumenthal Music Center in Tel Aviv on May 2 and the Jerusalem Music Center, Mishkenot Sha'ananim on May 10. The project is the result of a collaboration between the dynamic Atar Trio and celebrated American composer Judith Shatin. The program features music by current American and Israeli composers. "This is contemporary but communicative music," stresses Shelley. "The entire program mixes modern conceptions of sound with traditional elements."

The program includes Judith Shatin's View from Mount Nebo, inspired by the story of Moses looking toward the Promised Land he would never reach; Paul Schoenfield's Café Music, which combines elements of vernacular and classical cultures; and a trio by Benjamin Yusupov.
